Some of these words start with 'un' and some start with 'una'. Both words (un and una) mean 'a' in Spanish.

In Spanish, every **noun** has a gender (masculine/feminine).

What is a noun?

This is **not to do with whether it is a male or female**, they are just classed as masculine or feminine words.

Masculino (un)

Femenino (una)

un color      una foto      un túnel  
una pizza
