Some of these words start with '**un**' and some start with '**una**'. Both words (**un** and **una**) mean 'a' in Spanish.

In Spanish, every **noun** has a gender (**masculine/feminine**).

What is a noun?

This is **not to do with whether it is a male or female**, they are just classed as masculine or feminine words.
